

BiodiverseCitySTL - Forest Park Restoration Project

What happens after honeysuckle is removed? After all the hard work of volunteers and staff in past years, an area of Successional Forest (wooded area across from the Jewel Box) is finally rid of bush honeysuckle. Spring is the perfect time to take the next step in the restoration process: **planting**. Volunteers are requested to help plant upwards of 400 native tree whips (bare roots). This planting effort will improve the Successional Forest and enable the area to be more resistant to a repeat honeysuckle invasion.

Date: Tuesday, March 14, 2017

Time: 9 a.m. to Noon


Park: On McKinley Drive, across from the Jewel Box and just north of the McKinley Circle. See map below.


Volunteers should:

- Be comfortable using shovels and typical garden hand tools;
- Wear comfortable clothing that can dirty – long sleeves, long pants and sturdy, close-toed shoes (boots/tennis shoes) required;
- Bring a refillable water bottle (water will be available at project site);
