## Callirhoe triangulata

**Clustered Poppy-Mallow** 

- Family: Malvaceae [Gleason and Cronquist 1991, Judd et al. 2007]
- Notes: *Callirhoe triangulata* is native in Indiana and is currently known from a single plant.





Petals 5, 16–32 mm, deep pink (pinkish white); calyx 5-lobed, subtended by an epicalyx of 3 bractlets; stamens numerous, the filaments connate into a tube; ovaries 10–20, styles same number as ovaries. Blooms July 2–Oct 2.



Upper leaf; leaf blades 9–15 cm, about 2 times as long as wide, a few with shallow lobes, the lower with long petioles.





Perennial herb to 1 m, with stellate hairs. Dry open sandy areas, sand prairies.
