

Claytonia virginica

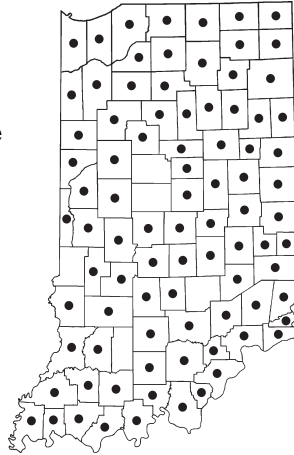
Virginia Spring-Beauty

Family: Portulacaceae [Gleason and Cronquist 1991, Judd et al. 2007]

Notes: *Claytonia virginica* is native in Indiana.



Leaf including leaf stalk to 7 cm, at least 8 times as long as wide, the leaf stalk scarcely differentiated.



Capsule 0.7–1 cm, opening by outcurving valves.



Petals 5, 7–10 mm, white to pink, with pink stripes, sepals 2; stamens 5, opposite the petals; ovary 1, style with 3 short lobes. Blooms Mar 21–June 14.
