Dicentra canadensis

Squirrelcorn

Fumariaceae [Gleason and Cronquist 1991], Papaveraceae [Judd et al. 2007]

Notes: Dicentra canadensis is native in Indiana; D. cucullaria is visually similar.







Petals 4, 2 outer and 2 smaller inner ones, the outer ones 12-16 mm long, white; sepals 2, usually fallen by flowering; stamens 6; ovary 1. Blooms Mar 31-May 30.



Bulblets globose, yellow, 0.4-0.6 cm long.



Perennial herb, the inflorescence a scape to 0.4 m. Woods.



Leaves 14-24 cm long, arising from the rhizome.
