

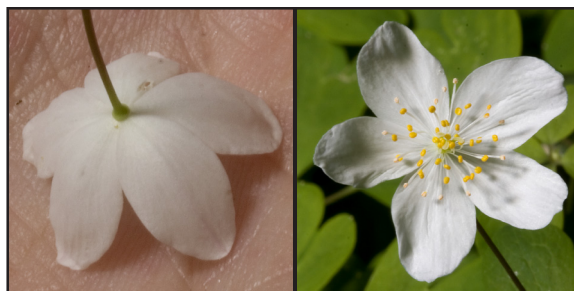
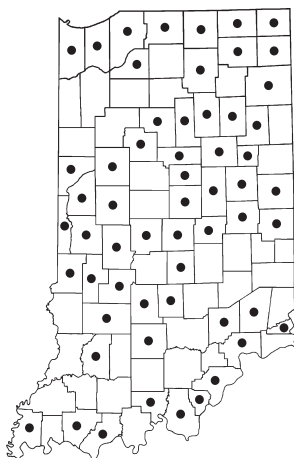
Enemion biternatum

False Rue-Anemone

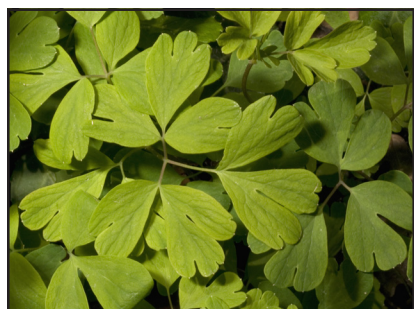
Family: Ranunculaceae [Gleason and Cronquist 1991, [Judd et al. 2007]

Other name: *Isopyrum biternatum*

Notes: *Enemion biternatum* is native in Indiana; *Thalictrum thalictroides* is visually similar.

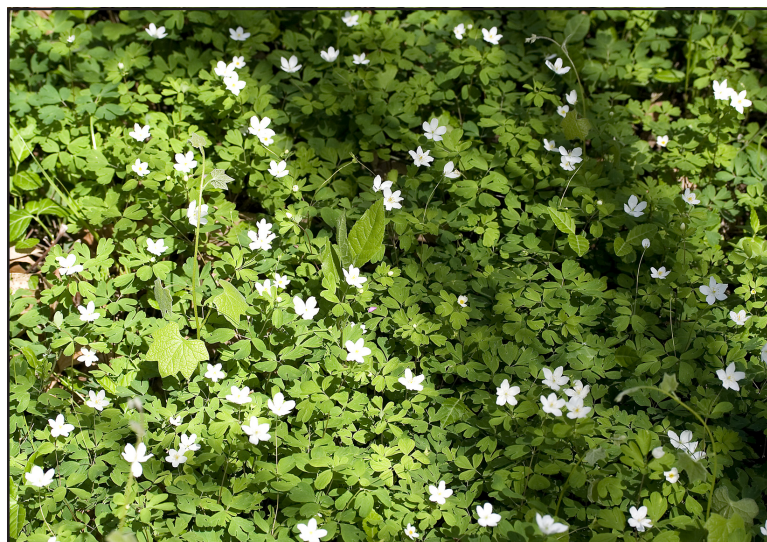


Petals none; sepals 5, 7–10 mm long, petaloid, white; stamens numerous, in several ranks; ovaries few. Blooms Mar 30–June 6.



Leaf 2–3-ternate, long-stemmed.

Plants usually found in large masses, the flowers similar in size, 1 flower above the nearest leaf.



Perennial herb to 0.4 m. Moist forests.
