


Hydrophyllum canadense


Broad-Leafed Waterleaf

Family: Hydrophyllaceae
[Gleason and Cronquist 1991],
Boraginaceae [Judd et al.
2007]

Notes: *Hydrophyllum canadense*
is native in Indiana.



Corolla 8–12 mm long, 5-lobed to near the base, white (pinkish); calyx 5-lobed to near the base; stamens 5, exserted 3–6 mm; ovary 1, style 1(2) deeply 2-parted. Blooms June 13–July 2.




Leaf to 22 × 20 cm.

Early leaves not in a basal rosette, often extending over a large area, mostly not much longer than wide and not divided to the midvein.



Perennial herb to 0.5 m; early leaves pinnately divided, later leaves palmately divided, about as long as wide, usually overtopping the inflorescence. Woods.
