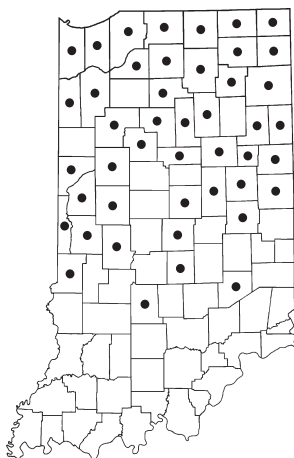


Hydrophyllum virginianum

Virginia Waterleaf

Family: Hydrophyllaceae [Gleason and Cronquist 1991],
Boraginaceae [Judd
et al. 2008]

Notes: *Hydrophyllum virginianum*
is native in Indiana.



Corolla 7–10 mm long, deeply 5-lobed, lavender or white; calyx deeply 5-lobed; stamens 5, long-exsert; ovary 1, style 1, long-exsert. Blooms May 8–June 17.

Inflorescence with stiff spreading hairs < 0.5 mm long.



Early leaves not in a basal rosette, often extending over a large area, mostly longer than wide and divided to the midvein.



Perennial herb to 0.8 m; leaves all pinnately divided. Woods, roadsides.
