

Phacelia ranunculacea

Buttercup Phacelia

Family:

Hydrophyllaceae [Gleason and Cronquist 1991], Boraginaceae [Judd et al. 2008]

Notes:

Phacelia ranunculacea is native in Indiana; *P. covillei* is visually similar.



Corolla 2.5–5.5 mm long, shallowly 5-lobed, pale violet to white; calyx deeply 5-lobed; stamens 5; ovary 1, style 1. Blooms May 4–10.



Terminal leaflet of leaf directly subtending an inflorescence with angle at base obtuse ($> 90^\circ$) to rounded or almost truncate.



Fruit 0.4–0.6 cm when mature.



Annual herb 0.1–0.3 m tall, middle portion of stem with with long (most > 2 mm) spreading, thin hairs and dense glandular hairs. Moist forests.
