Thalictrum thalictroides

Rue-Anemone

Family: Ranunculaceae [Gleason and Cronquist 1991, Judd et al. 2007]

Other name: Anemonella thalic troides

Notes: Thalictrum thalictroides is native in Indiana; Enemion biternatum is visually similar.



Extreme doubling of the number of petaloid sepals sometimes occurs.

Petals none; sepals usually 6 or more, petaloid, to 8 mm long, white, (pink); stamens numerous, in several ranks; ovaries 8-10. Blooms Mar 17-June 22.



Plants usually found as a solitary plant or with a few other plants, rarely in large masses, usually with a central flower with 2 smaller subtending ones above the nearest leaf.



Perennial herb to 0.3 m. Forests.
